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APPLICATION GUIDELINES

Kindly read the information below before you complete an application online

1. One applicant should submit only one application.
2. For one to apply online, s/he should have an active e-mail account
3. Prospective applicants should read the entry requirements carefully and ensure that they apply for programmes for which they meet the general and specific entry requirements including the Application Cut Off points. Meeting the minimum entry requirements does not guarantee admission as admission is based on academic merit and availability of space.
4. A list of undergraduate programmes offered by the University of Botswana and the Guide on Application Cut-off points are part of the Application Package. **ALL THE UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES OF STUDY ARE ACCREDITED AND/OR REGISTERED ON THE NATIONAL CREDIT AND QUALIFICATION FRAMEWORK (NCQF) BY THE BOTSWANA QUALIFICATIONS AUTHORITY (BOA).** Applicants are therefore advised to select programmes carefully taking into account the strength of their grades and the 2026 Guide on Application Cut-off points. The 2026 Guide on Application Cut-Off Points are a Guide only and should therefore not be treated as the **Final Admission Cut-Off Points.**
5. In completing the application, prospective applicants should enter their study choices in order of preference, and then select the programme offer mode such as Full-time, Part-time or Distance Learning, and the Campus where each of the two programmes is offered.
6. Prospective applicants are required to pay an **APPLICATION FEE, WHICH IS NON REFUNDABLE**, online through the link <https://www.ub.bw/ubpayments> or into the University of Botswana (UB) bank accounts listed under Financial Procedures, which is part of the Application Package. Prospective applicants may **ONLY PAY** the Application Fee if they meet all the set requirements as the **APPLICATION FEE IS NON REFUNDABLE.**
7. The receipt for the Application Fee payment should be scanned in readiness for uploading into the application.

A copy of the payment receipt should be kept safely by the applicant.

8. For programmes of study that require work experience, a reference statement from the applicant's supervisor confirming the nature and length of the work experience should be scanned in readiness for uploading into the application. The applicant must have the required experience by the date of submission of the application.
9. Normal Entry: Normal Entry means that an applicant is in possession of the requirements as stated in the intended programme of study, e.g. School Certificate/Statement of Results, Certificate/Degree/Diploma Certificate, and/or the required work experience in some cases.
10. Mature Age Entry (MAE): This is a special route reserved only for Botswana nationals who do not possess the normal entry qualifications. Applicants under this category are required to take appropriate MAE Examination. Undergraduate study programmes with this special entry route have this listed under their specific requirements.
11. Applicants, who applied for programmes with an interview or test as part of the selection process, are advised to enquire about the schedules for such if they do not receive any notification one month after the closing date.
12. Applicants will be notified of the dates of the selection interview(s) or test(s) they are required to attend and those who for whatever reason fail to attend a scheduled oral or written interview, will automatically be dropped from the selection list for that particular programme.
13. Applicants are also encouraged to always keep safe the information they receive during the application period and through the acknowledgement notification they will receive from Undergraduate Admissions office.
14. Applicants with Disability: The University of Botswana welcomes applicants with disability and considers their applications on academic merit like all other applicants. All applicants are expected to state whether they have any disability or not when they apply, so that the University's Disability Support Services Unit can contact them to appreciate the nature of their disability. The declaration of such information helps the University in assessing the learning needs of all applicants. Prospective applicants with disability may

contact University's Disability Support Services Unit at: (+267) 355-2768/4990/4991/4183. University of Botswana will at all times preserve the confidentiality of student information.

15. Prospective applicants are expected to scan and save separately, preferably in pdf format, all the required documents in readiness for uploading during application:
- receipt for a fully paid Application Fee
 - certified copy of the Omang for citizens ONLY or the Passport for other nationalities
 - certified copy of the School certificate (or a certified copy of the Statement of Results for those still awaiting the issuance of their certificates), accompanied (if not in English) by a certified official English translation version.
 - certified copies of additional official documents e.g. post-school certificate(s), transcript(s), professional registration certificate(s), certifying letters from Examining bodies, proof of change of name, etc where applicable.

NB: Citizens under the age of 16 or those who have applied for Omang as they have just reached the age of 16 should provide certified copies of their Birth Certificates

16. The onus is on all applicants to ensure that they upload all required documents with their application. Any application that does not have all the required documents will not be processed.
17. How to complete an Application Online: University of Botswana (UB) has an online application system that is intended to accord anyone seeking admission into UB study programmes to apply online provided they have an active email account. Prospective applicants are therefore expected to make their applications online through the "STUDY" link on the University of Botswana Website: www.ub.bw. Prospective applicants may use any Internet facility available to them to apply anytime of the day during the application period.
18. A guide, in the form of a booklet, on how to complete an application online, titled "ONLINE APPLICATION: A STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE", is provided through the "STUDY" link.

19. Once you have submitted your application, an acknowledgement notification will be sent to you by email.
20. Selection Procedure: The Undergraduate Admissions office will review and process applications immediately after the closing date and applicants who are required to attend selection interviews or tests will be notified accordingly.
21. Applicants must ensure that they provide correct Email Address and Mobile number as these will be used to communicate any matter regarding their applications.
22. Change of Name/Surname: Applicants are to provide proof of change of name(s) if their Certificate(s) and/or other official documents show different names. THE UNIVERSITY ONLY ACCEPTS AN AFFIDAVIT FROM THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND HOME AFFAIRS.
23. Applicants are encouraged to always request for the name of the UB officer attending them either telephonically or otherwise.

GENERAL ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- a. The general minimum ENTRY requirements to the University shall be the Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 such as Botswana General Certificate of Secondary Education (BGCSE)/or equivalent qualification with at least six subjects NOT below a grade of E.
- b. For all programmes, English Language shall be one of the qualifying subjects.
- c. English Language must at least be a minimum of grade C for non-science degree programmes and at least a minimum of grade D for science-based programmes.
- d. For Bachelor's degree programmes, at least five subjects shall be at a minimum of grade C obtained at one or two examination sittings.
- e. For Diploma and Certificate programmes, at least a minimum of three grades of C with a minimum of grade E in English Language shall be required. Five subjects may be considered if the minimum cut-off point based on six subjects is met.
- f. The minimum entry Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent overall points shall be 34 points for all undergraduate Degree and 30 points for Diploma and Certificate programmes.
- g. The stipulated length of relevant work experience where required must have been met at the time of submitting the application.
- h. Any additional and/or special ENTRY requirements shall be specified under the programme offerings.
- i. Applicants shall be considered only for the study programmes they have selected.
- j. When applying for a programme which is offered by both full-time and distance learning mode, indicate whether the application is for full-time or distance learning, otherwise if not indicated it will be assumed the application is for a full-time programme.

- k. Meeting the minimum entry requirements does not guarantee admission. Admission will depend on availability of space and the competitive strength of each applicant's grades.
- l. Applicants may make changes to their programme choices. Such changes should be communicated in writing to the undergraduate admissions office.
- m. Applicants with Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent with a minimum of grade E in English Language may be considered for admission into the Bachelor's degree programmes.
- n. Applicants may be considered through Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) and Credit Accumulation and Transfer (CAT)

FULL-TIME PROGRAMMES

Note:

University of Botswana has observed that the Admission Cut Off Points for different study programmes average around both the Overall and Programme Points listed. The said averages are displayed as the Application Cut Off Points, which **serve as a guide to prospective applicants as they select their study choices**. Both the Overall and Programme Points listed are the minimum points that each prospective applicant has to satisfy in order to apply for their study choices.

Some programmes show Overall Points ONLY; while others show both the Overall and Programme Points. Admission into programmes with the Overall Points is based on OVERALL POINTS ONLY, while admission into programmes with both the Overall and Programme Points is based on PROGRAMME POINTS, although they also have to meet the Overall Points.

Prospective applicants should note that these Application cut-off points are just a Guide, NOT THE FINAL ADMISSION CUT OFF POINTS, hence meeting them does not guarantee admission.

School of Marketing, Tourism and Hospitality

Bachelor of Business (Tourism and Hospitality Management)

Duration: 4 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent with a minimum of grade C in English Language and Mathematics.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 34

Applicants in possession of a recognized Diploma in Tourism and/or Hospitality Management may be considered for admission into this programme.

Bachelor of Business Administration (International Business)

Duration: 4 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent with a minimum of grade C in English Language and Mathematics.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 36

Applicants with a Diploma in Accounting and Business Studies or equivalent qualification may be considered for entry at level 100 or 200 into any of the Degree programmes mentioned above.

Bachelor of Business Administration (Entrepreneurship and Enterprise Development)

Duration: 4 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent with a minimum of grade C in English Language and Mathematics.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 34

Bachelor of Business Administration Logistics and Supply Chain Management

Duration: 4 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent with a minimum of grade C in English Language and Mathematics.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 40

Applicants possessing a Diploma in Criminal Justice Studies from this University will be admitted into Level 300.

Bachelor of Laws (Honours)

Duration: 5 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent obtained at one sitting with a minimum of grade C in English Language.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 44

Applicants possessing a Diploma in Law of this University with a minimum classification of a credit or equivalent qualification will be considered.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

The Bachelor of Commerce in Finance Program aims at providing quality graduates with skills in financial management, international finance, international monetary system, investment management, credit management, banking practice, marketing of financial services, credit risk management, actuarial analysis, corporate risk management, tax planning and insurance.

Bachelor of Business Administration (Management): Graduates of this programme can be employed in numerous professional positions available in different sectors of the economy such as project managers,

management consultants, self employed entrepreneurs, operational managers/strategists, logistics and inventory managers, administrative officers, human resources managers, training and development officers, corporate management experts, organization and management analysts, planners and development management experts and system analysts.

Bachelor of Business (Tourism & Hospitality Management): This program will definitely widen the students employment opportunities and upgrade management skills in the following areas: Hotel/camp manager; Travel consultants/Agents; Tour operators; Professional guide, Tourism officer; Wildlife conservation manager; Reservation officers; Finance officer for tourism and hospitality organisation; Tourism researcher/lecturer; Marketing manager; Tourism Planning/Development officer; Events managers.

Bachelor of Business Administration (Entrepreneurship and Enterprise Development): Graduates of this program will; be able to conceptualize, initiate, establish and operate entrepreneurial ventures in any sector of the economy; Serve as trainers in entrepreneurship and enterprise development skills within Botswana's social structure; Provide leadership in the process of entrepreneurship and enterprise development; Serve as key sources of promoting corporate entrepreneurship in organizations they work for; Participate in economic policy drive as entrepreneurship policy analysts, auditors, and evaluators.

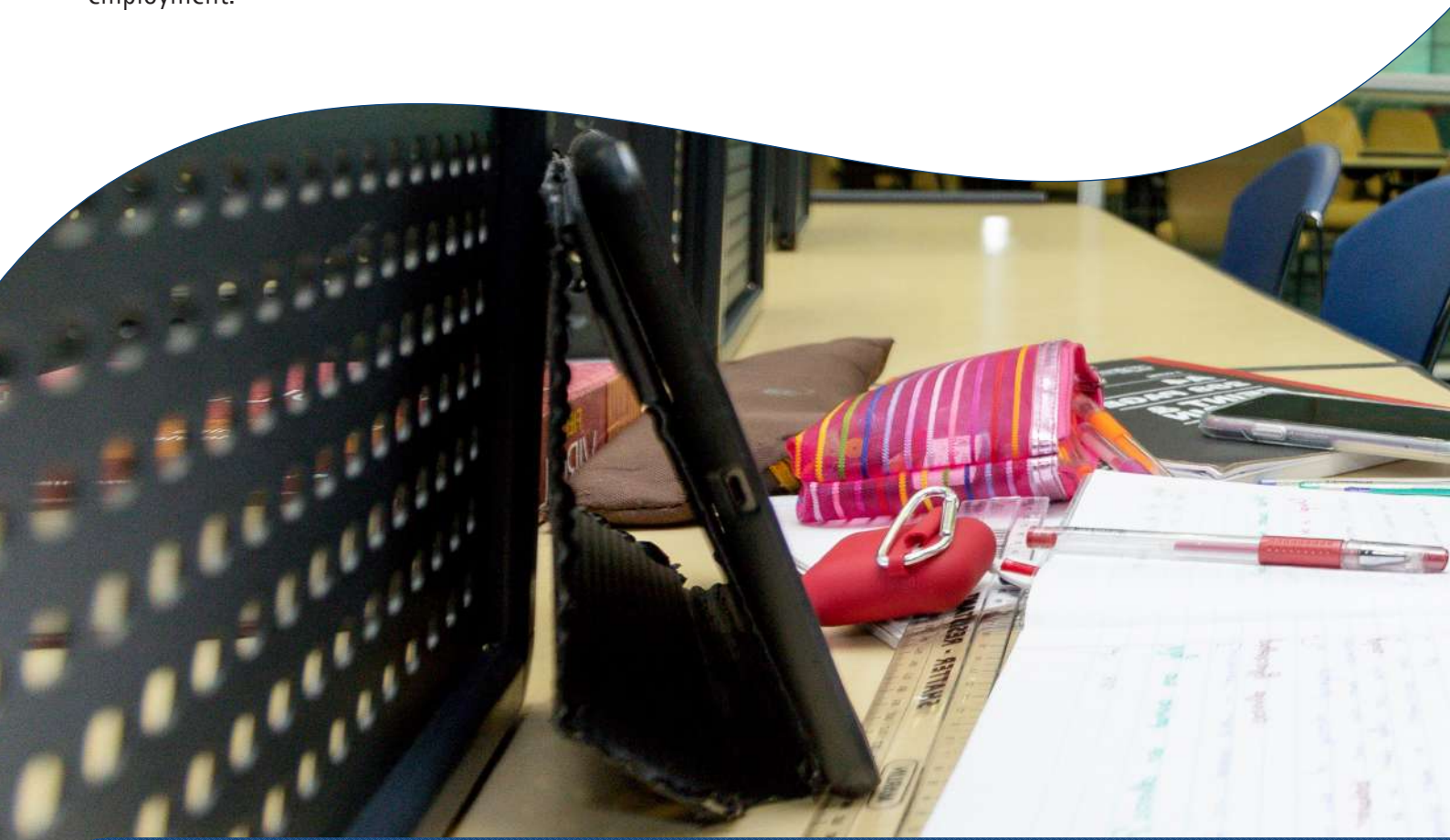
Bachelor of Business Administration Logistics and Supply Chain Management: Graduates of this program can serve as; Purchasing officers/managers; Distribution officers/managers; Warehouse officers/managers; Transport; Tendering; Procurement; Logistics officers; FMCGS; Acquittal staff (customs, broker, shipping agent etc.); Inventory controllers; Demand Planners.

Bachelor of Business Administration (International Business): Employment opportunities are available in multiple sectors of the economy: Botswana SMEs; Multi-national corporations; inter-government organisations and NGO's; Government Departments and authorities with international involvement; Travel, tourism, and hospitality industry targeting foreign markets; International freight forwarding, shipping logistics and distribution firms; Telecommunications and internet-based businesses with global reach; Foreign diplomatic and trade representation in Botswana and SADC; Management consultancies, research agencies and industry associations etc.

Bachelor of Business (Information Systems): Graduates of this programme can be employed as systems analysts, programmers, system integrators, network administrators, database administrator, web-developers, systems security officers, and end-user specialists, computer auditors, projects managers and telecommunications specialists.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 34

Bachelor of Arts in Public Administration

Duration: 4 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent with a minimum grade C in English Language and grade E in Mathematics.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 34

Bachelor of Arts in Social Sciences

Duration: 4 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent with a minimum grade C in English Language. A grade of C or better in Mathematics is required for Economics, Population Studies, and Statistics. A grade of E or above in Mathematics is required for Political Science, Public Administration, and Sociology.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 34

The programme is offered as follows:

i. Combined Degree (major/major)

A student can combine two subjects from the following:

Economics, Public Administration, Political Science, Population Studies, Sociology & Statistics.

ii. Single major

a) Students may be admitted directly into the following programmes:

**Bachelor of Arts in Economics, Bachelor of Arts in Public Administration,
Bachelor of Arts in Political Science**

b) Alternatively upon successful completion of the required courses at Level 100 and 200 of the Bachelor of Arts Social Sciences degree programme and subject to meeting all other programme requirements, a student may apply for admission to take Bachelor of Arts as a single major and thus enrol at Level 300 in any one of the following programmes:

**Bachelor of Arts in Economics
Bachelor of Arts in Public Administration
Bachelor of Arts in Political Science**

Applicants possessing a Diploma in Statistics, Diploma in Population Studies, and Diploma in Criminal Justice of this University or equivalent will be considered for the relevant degree programme.

Bachelor of Psychology (Honours)

Duration: 4 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent with a minimum of grade C in English Language, Mathematics, and any Science subject.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 40

Bachelor of Social Work

Duration: 4 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent with a minimum of grade C in English Language and Mathematics.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 36

Applicants possessing a Diploma in Social Work from this University or equivalent qualification with a minimum of Credit shall be eligible for entry to level 200.

Bachelor of Arts in History

Duration: 4 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent with a minimum of grade C in English Language.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 34

Bachelor of Arts in Humanities

Duration: 4 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent with a minimum of grade C in English Language.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 34

Applicants possessing a Diploma qualification from other tertiary institutions may be considered for entry at Level 100, 200 depending on the quality and number of credits obtained and subject combinations.

Bachelor of Arts in Pastoral Care and Counselling

Duration: 4 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent with a minimum of grade C in English Language.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 34

Holders of a BGCSE who do not meet the above requirement shall be admitted under Mature Age Entry Scheme.

Holders of Diploma in Theology and Religious Studies from an accredited institution shall be admitted into Level 200.

Holders of a Junior Certificate of Education, who have many years of experience in Pastoral Care and Counselling can be admitted into Level 100 provided they have satisfied the Mature Age Entry requirements.

Bachelor of Education (Lifelong Learning and Community Development)

Duration: 4 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent with a minimum of grade C in English Language. Preference shall be given to applicants with some work experience in adult education, extension work and community development.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 34

Applicants possessing a Diploma in Adult Education or related field will be considered for entry at Level 300. Preference shall be given to applicants with some work experience in adult education, extension work and community development.

Diploma in Social Work

Duration: 3 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent with a minimum of grade C in English Language.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 30

Applicants possessing a Certificate in Social Work from this University, or an equivalent qualification will be considered.

Diploma in Lifelong Learning and Community Development

Duration: 2 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Certificate IV, NCQF Level 4 (BGCSE)/equivalent. Preference shall be given to applicants with some work experience in adult education, extension work and community development.

Application Cut-off points

Overall Points (Best 6 Subjects): 30

Applicants who do not meet the above requirements but have BGCSE and evidence of relevant prior learning and experience in adult education, extension work, and community development may be considered. Applicants seeking admission through this route may be called for assessment.

Applicants possessing a Certificate in Adult Education or in a related field may be admitted to Level 200.

School of Education

Bachelor of Education (Biology)

Duration: 4 years

Specific Entry Requirements

Social Sciences graduates enter the world of work in the various sectors of the economy. Career prospects for degree holders include professional employment in the fields of:

Research: The various programmes offered in the faculty prepare graduates to enter in the field to research depending on their programme of study. Graduates often get employment in Divisions of planning, statistics and research in the various ministries, Private Sector, Parastatals, Non-Government organisations and United Nations Agencies depending on their areas of specialization.

Policy Development: Social Scientists in their various fields of specialization are engaged in policy development in the various sectors of the economy.

Planning: Graduates are equipped with the skills that prepare them to join the civil service, private sector, non-government organisations in the various field of planning e.g. manpower planning, development planning etc.

Civil Service: Graduates are often employed in the various departments of government and parastatals depending on the area of specialization.

Consultants: Most Social Scientists join the field of consulting depending on their area of Study.

Social Work: graduates can work in the following areas: welfare agencies; police; prisons or defence force; schools, hospitals and hospice; palliative care work; youth and public relations officers; human rights activists; substance abuse counsellors; managers and programme directors in parastatals, non-governmental organisations and community based organisations; teaching in university and colleges; conduct research and policy analyst.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Ample career opportunities exist for graduates in the Health Sciences. Graduates can become health care practitioners in various health facilities in Botswana or elsewhere, managers of units and coordinators of programmes within hospitals, local authorities and industry, environmental health officers, laboratory scientists, nursing officers and nursing specialists. In addition, graduates can find opportunities in clinical research and have the opportunity of joining the Institute of Health Sciences or the University as lecturers.

Graduates may choose to divert to related areas of study or practice. For instance, environmental health graduates may divert to Biology and Ecology, nurses may divert into insurance areas, and laboratory scientists divert into medical sales work. In addition to careers mentioned above graduates are attractive to international markets.

Medicine: Botswana has an acute need for medical practitioners, and this therefore places our graduates at a great advantage. Majority of doctors work in government clinics and hospitals but can also work in private clinics and hospitals and in academic institutions. However, many employment opportunities exist in other countries and international organizations including United Nations agencies (WHO, UNICEF, UNAIDS), the World Bank and regional organizations. Employment in other countries may require the fulfilment of specific licensing and registration regulations.

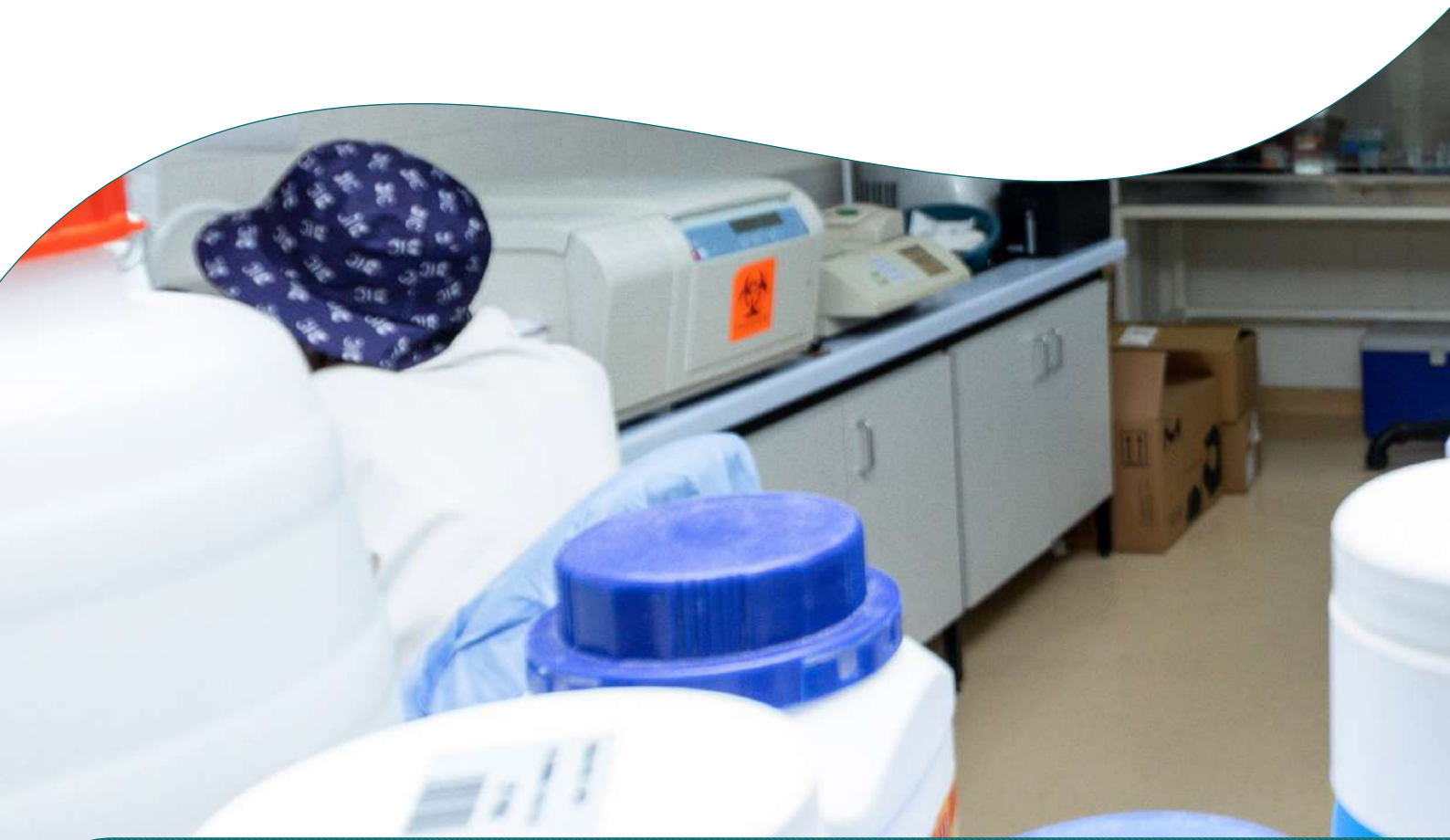

COMPUTER SCIENCE: Computing academics, computer programmer/analyst, applications programmer, software engineer, hardware engineer, computing network administrator, database administrator, systems consultant, marketing representative, information systems manager.

GEOLOGY: Prospective employers include Botswana GeoScience Institute, Water Affairs, Roads. Other employers include mining, mineral and groundwater exploration companies, environmental institutions.

PHYSICS: Prospective employers include Department of Radiation Protection, Botswana Bureau of Standards, Department of Meteorological Services, Scientific laboratories, Energy Affairs Division, Geophysical exploration companies, mining companies, Botswana GeoScience Institute, Botswana Police and Botswana Defence Force (e.g. Air Force and communications division).
